Public Works Employment Verification Act
Project: Steel High HS/MS (Renovations)
Steel Valley School District

Dear Mr. Golon:

This correspondence shall serve as official notice that, as a result of an investigation or audit conducted by the Department of General Services, Golon Masonry Restoration & Sealants, Inc ("Golon Masonry") has been found to be in violation of Section 5(1) of the Public Works Employment Verification Act (the "Act"). The details of the violation are as follows:

The Act was effective January 1, 2013, and requires every public works contractor and subcontractor to utilize the federal E-Verify Program ("EVP"), operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security, to verify the employment eligibility of new employees hired on or after January 1, 2013. Public works contractors and subcontractors must be in compliance with the Act prior to the award of the contract. Employees hired after the award of the public works contract must be verified within 5 business days of his or her start date.


By letter dated April 19, 2016, the Department requested Golon Masonry to provide specific information establishing compliance with the Act. A review of the documentation submitted reveals that Golon Masonry was awarded a public works contract by the Steel Valley School District on June 15, 2015. According to the information submitted in response to the audit, Golon Masonry hired a total of approximately two (2) employees after the award of the contract. Golon Masonry submitted a Public Works Employment Verification Form acknowledging that it was in compliance with the Act as of April 28, 2016, prior to the award of the contract. However, Golon Masonry did not initiate verification of the two new employees until on or after April 29, 2016, more than five business days after the employees' respective start date. Therefore, it is the Department's conclusion that Golon Masonry did not properly utilize the EVP system to verify new employees in accordance with the Act and is in violation of Section 5(1) of the Act.

This is Golon Masonry's first violation under the Act. As required by Section 6(d) (1), this first violation warning letter will be posted to the Department's publicly accessible website. If Golon Masonry fails to comply with the Act or commits subsequent violations thereof, Golon Masonry may be subject to civil penalties as well as debarment by the Department as provided for in Section 6.

If Golon Masonry wishes to appeal this determination, you must submit a written request for an administrative hearing setting forth all of the facts upon which the appeal is based within ten (10) calendar days of the date of this letter to the Deputy Secretary for Procurement, Department of General Services, 6th Floor, Forum Place, 555 Walnut Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17101. A filing fee of \$100.00, in the form of a certified check or money order payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of General Services, must be enclosed with the request.

Please refer to the Department's web site at www.dgs.state.pa.gov for additional information on the requirements of the Act as well as the appeal procedures to be followed if Golon Masonry requests an administrative hearing. Your cooperation with the Department in complying with the Act is appreciated.
