RFQ CHANGES

1. **DELETE** answer to Question 13 of Bulletin #4 in its entirety.

QUESTIONS (Responses in bold text)

- 1. On page 2 of the Notice to Offerors, the "Quote Period" states "60 days allowed from Quote Submission Deadline until Notice of Selection." However, on page 23 of the RFQ, under Section 2.2 Quote Submission, it states "For this RFQ, the Quote Submission, as submitted, must remain valid for 180 calendar days after the Quote Submission Deadline." Please clarify the quote submission period, and how many days ESCO proposals need to be valid? The Commonwealth is allowed up to 60 days from the Quote Submission Deadline to issue a Notice of Selection. Quotes submissions are valid for 180 days from the Quote Submission Deadline.
- 2. In Bulletin #4, DGS's response to question #13, which relates to Warranty Services, states: "All construction for 1 year after construction plus performance for length of payback period. Article 8.2 of Attachment M will remain as written." Please confirm that DGS requires ESCOs to include the costs associated with providing full warranty services on all newly installed equipment and systems for the full twenty (20) year repayment term. Note, this approach requires the allocation of project energy savings to address post-construction services, which results in less capital improvements being implemented. Please confirm if this is the Commonwealth's intention. Article 8.2 of Attachment M remains as written. For warranty information, see language regarding warranties as discussed throughout the RFQ and its Appendices.
- 3. In an effort to get the best value and most creative ideas regarding ECMs at SCI Muncy we have had 14 different subcontractors provide scopes and pricing for SCI Muncy. Listing all our subcontractors and their qualifications and personnel will far exceed the 8 suggested pages for the Subcontractor section of the proposal. How would you like us to proceed regarding our subcontractor qualifications? Submit quotes as required by the RFQ. The 8 pages are "suggested".

- 4. Will SCI Muncy allow wireless systems to be used in any part of the facility for DDC controls? **No.**
- 5. Can the proposed, new Energy Management System (EMS) implementation and upgrades use the state's network to connect the buildings with proposed EMS system? Will the proposed, new Energy Management System (EMS) implementation and upgrades be required to provide a separate network? Yes, a separate network is recommended.
- 6. In Bulletin 3 Q.3 "Natural gas is under a fixed price contract through October 2019 for \$2.759 per dekatherm.". Should the fixed price (\$2.759) be added to the Baseline Summary on page 9 of Bulletin #2 or is it already included in the baseline? The provided baseline data indicates the average total natural gas cost for the most recent 12 months is \$3.24 per MCF. During that period, the gas commodity component of that costs was \$1.87 per dekatherm, or approximately \$1.93 per MCF (assuming a standard conversion of 1030 Btu/cubic foot). The current fixed price of \$2.759 per dekatherm, or \$2.84 per MCF represents an increased cost of \$0.91 per MCF. We recommend setting the natural gas price at \$4.15 (\$3.24 + \$0.91).
- 7. In an effort to keep the project budget neutral but still address critical items in "Appendix T" would the Agency be agreeable to replacing only the leaking sections of the West Loop Steam and Condensate piping runs rather than replacing the entire underground piping with new steam and condensate pipe? The Funding Agency prefers that the entire Western Loop would be replaced due to the age of the piping.
- 8. What is an estimate of the visitors/day at the site? The average inmate visitors per visiting day is approximately 50.
- 9. With limited ability to visit all buildings, can you provide how many cells are in each of the buildings? Prototypical housing units J & S are 126 cells each. Older style housing varies greatly. A copy of the housing unit bed report attached at the end of this bulletin.
- 10. Are there any assumed hours of operation for the lighting? Cells? Corridors? Offices? The assumed hours of operation are 0730 1530. Extended afternoon hours may be approved in specific designated areas.
- 11. "Conversion of interior lighting shall be limited to occupied buildings" Can we get a designation of which buildings are not occupied? **Currently, all buildings are occupied.**
- 12. What is the annual usage/cost of the diesel for the Generators utilized for emergency power? The large generators had 22 hour of run time in 2017, burning 990 gallons of diesel fuel. The small generators had 63 hours of run time in 2017, burning 945 gallons of diesel fuel.
- 13. On previous PA DOC projects, we have had as many as 10-12 PA DOC escorts available during the normal dayshift Monday–Friday, to accompany our work crews, will that many escorts be available on a daily basis at SCI Muncy? **No**
- 14. On previous PA DOC projects, we were not charged for escort time by DOC if the escorts were provided during the normal daylight shift Monday-Friday, will that be the case at SCI Muncy. **Yes**

- 15. If some of our work needs to be done after normal daylight working hours or on weekends will we be charged by PA DOC for escorts working overtime and what would the applicable overtime rate be? The Funding Agency, PA DOC, would have to charge for overtime to manage costs. The average overtime hourly rate is estimated at \$45.00 per hour.
- 16. Our bonding Surety is asking for a 'non-Draft' version of "Appendix C Construction Bid Bond". Can you supply that? **Yes; a copy is attached at the end of this bulletin.**
